Swapping records (targeted record swapping), for example, if a household was likely to be identified in datasets because it has unusual characteristics, ONS swapped the record with a similar one from a nearby small area. Very unusual households could be swapped with one in a nearby local authority; b). Adding small changes to some counts (cell key perturbation), for example, ONS might change a count of four to a three or a five. This might make small differences between tables depending on how the data were broken down when ONS applied perturbation.

4. The SDC applied by ONS means the same variable in different tables, for example total residents in the Age Structure table and total residents in the Ethnic Group table, may have small differences, but this does not intrinsically impact the interpretation of the data. These differences will also be present in geographic hierarchies, for example summing the resident population of all Wards in Dudley Local Authority may result in a slightly different total to the resident population of the ONS data for Dudley Local Authority.

Glossary

Census Day: Census day was Sunday 21 March 2021.

Central Heating: A household's accommodation is classified as having central heating if it is present in some or all rooms (whether used / working or not).

Communal Establishment: An establishment providing managed residential accommodation. "Managed" means providing full or part-time supervision of the accommodation. Example establishments include those for medical or care; education; armed forces establishments; detention establishments; travel or temporary accommodation; religious establishments; staff or worker accommodation, with the exception of nurses' accommodation; hotels, guest houses, B&Bs, inns and pubs with residential accommodation with space for seven or more guests.

Dependent Child: A person aged 0-15 in a household (whether or not in a family) or aged 16-18 in full-time education and living in a family with his or her parent(s). It does not include any children who have a spouse, partner or child living in the household.

Economically Active: People aged 16 years and over who between 15 March and 21 March 2021 were: in employment (an employee or self-employed); or unemployed, but looking for work and could start within two weeks; or unemployed, but waiting to start a job that had been offered and accepted.

Economically Inactive: People aged 16 years and over who did not have a job between 15 March to 21 March 2021 and had not looked for work between 22 February to 21 March 2021 or could not start work within two weeks.

General Health: A person's assessment of the general state of their health. This assessment is not based on a person's health over any specified period of time.

Household: Either one person living alone, or a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room, sitting room or dining area. A household must contain at least one person whose place of usual residence is at the address.

Industry: Classifies people aged 16 years and over who were in employment the week before the census by the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code for their industry or business.

Hours Worked Per Week: The number of hours worked in the week before the census, including paid and unpaid overtime.

England

Lone Parent Household: Comprises a father or mother with his or her child(ren) where the parent does not have a spouse, same-sex civil partner or partner in the household and the child(ren) do not have a spouse, same-sex civil partner or child in the household.

Occupation: Classifies what people aged 16 years and over who were in employment the week before the census do as their main job. Job title, details of job activities and any supervisory or management responsibilities form this classification. This information is used to code responses to an occupation using the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) 2020.

Provision Of Unpaid Care: An unpaid carer may look after, give help or support to anyone who has long-term physical or mental ill-health conditions, illness or problems related to old age. This does not include any activities as part of paid employment. This help can be within or outside of the carer's household.

Resident: Refers to a usual resident which is anyone who, on census day, was in the UK and had stayed or intended to stay in the UK for a period of 12 months or more, or had a permanent UK address and was outside the UK and intended to be outside the UK for less than 12 months.

Qualification, Highest Level: The highest level of qualification attained by residents aged 16 years and over based on the following equivalencies:

Level 1 and entry level: 1 to 4 GCSEs (grade A*-C), any GCSEs at other grades, O Levels or CSEs (any grades); 1 AS level, NVQ level 1, Foundation GNVQ, Basic or Essential Skills Level 2: 5 or more GCSEs (A* to C or 9 to 4), O levels (passes), CSEs (grade 1), School Certification, 1 A level, 2 to 3 AS levels, VCEs, Intermediate or Higher Diploma, Welsh Baccalaureate Intermediate Diploma, NVQ level 2, Intermediate GNVQ, City and Guilds Craft, BTEC First or General Diploma, RSA Diploma



Room: Defined as any room in a dwelling apart from bathrooms, toilets, halls or landings, kitchens, conservatories or utility rooms. All other rooms, for example, living rooms, studies, bedrooms, separate dining rooms and rooms that can only be used for storage are included. This is based on the Valuation Office Agency's (VOA) definition.










